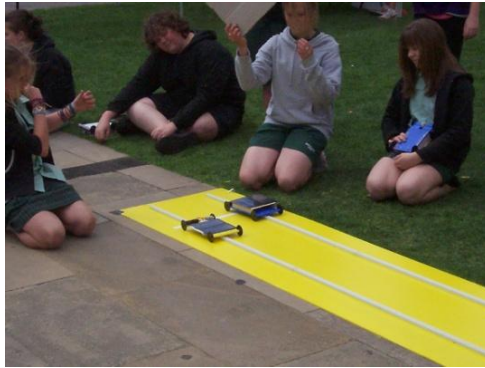
TAS Technology Challenges

team achieved third place with the boat designed by Cameron Stack.

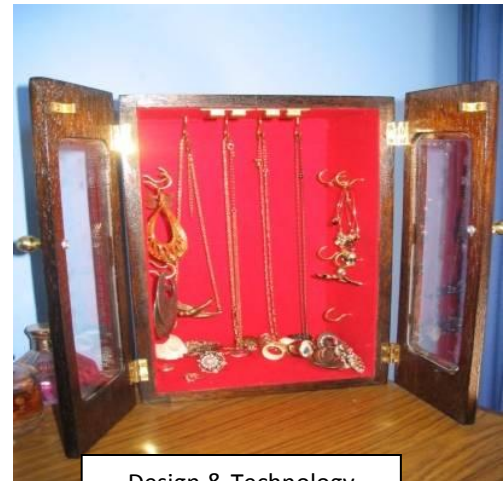

Mathematics

Mathematics Department has recently trialled a computer application called think.literacy, looking at the numeracy component of it as part of our commitment to working with Newcastle University and the 'BOOST' program. A cross-section of year 9 students has been asked to complete a numeracy task to trial the actual running of the computer application. While the main focus is on the actual program, the feedback to students will include strategies and tasks to strengthen their understanding of Mathematical concepts.

Next year, assessment for our stage 4 and stage 5 students will be a little different. Rather than topic tests, Mathematics will be moving to four major tests per year for most classes, with a component for homework, class work and assignments. As well as homework set by classroom teachers, it will be an expectation that all students complete homework through Moodle, which will be tracked by Mrs Woodley. Any student who has yet to join Moodle and needs help should see Mrs Woodley during lunch or recess to receive assistance. Similarly, if students have no access to internet at home, they may be given access to a computer room at recess to complete the tasks. These homework tasks, particularly for year 7 and 8 students are based on NAPLAN questions and as such provide very good revision.

Part of our focus is on building closer relationships with our feeder Primary School in an effort to make the transition from Primary to High School less stressful. Staff have been working together, looking at strategies and ideas for engagement next year and are really looking forward to trying some of these ideas.

Northlakes High School is committed to reducing bullying incidents and I am proud of the level of commitment from year 7 so far.

Year 11 Report

During a recent year assembly Ms Russell spoke on achieving in the HSC. While many students seemed to identify with some of the major points of her excellent presentation, I realise that sometimes these things sound great at the time but are quickly forgotten. I would like to highlight a couple of key ideas.

Milestones. The concept here is that we have a number of milestones, or steps along the way, to HSC success. We will be looking at regular identification and recognition of high achieving students, and targeting underperforming students who are not fulfilling their responsibilities in the senior school.

The six milestones on the way to HSC success have been identified as:

- Attendance
- Notes
- Homework
- Revision – mind maps, flash cards, summaries
- Extended responses
- Extra classes – recess, lunch, before or after school

Students need to make the effort to regularly tick off each of these milestones as a concrete way to maximise their HSC performance.

Ms Russell has also approached a number of students inviting them to participate the Step-Up mentoring program. Small groups or individual students will meet regularly with chosen staff members with the aim of increasing student performance in the HSC through positive intervention and mentoring.

Initial invitations to students to participate in this program have been extended to students with the best preliminary results and those involved in the maths boost program. Ms Russell has extended a further invitation to any other student who would like to be involved in this program to contact her directly.

While the rest of the school is finished for the year, it is important to remember that the HSC year is already underway and that the upcoming holidays should involve some regular school work. Even a couple of hours a week

of study, such as reading set texts, consolidation of term four notes and classwork or time spent on major works or extended assignments, will make everything easier next year.

I hope that everyone has a safe and enjoyable holiday and look forward to continuing the HSC year in 2011.
