From our Principal:

Dear Parents, Guardians and students

Thank you to all who responded to our recent survey, and attended our first parent forum. We are determined to continue to improve our interaction with our school community, and to respond to your queries.

A number of people commented positively on teacher's communication, quality of teaching, the school's app, uniform, positive postcard, longer periods, e-mailing of newsletters, website, house structure, consequences for lateness, safety of the school, and support for senior students and their study periods.

Issues for improvement mentioned by three or more included communication issues within the school, and between school and parents, implementation of individual education plans, publicised programs for gifted and talented students, need for school to increase positive promotion in the community.

There were a lot of things mentioned by just one person. I have taken the whole list to an extended executive meeting which was held on Tuesday 25th March 2014, and we are aiming to address as many as we can.

Of course, if you have a particular concern, please contact a member of staff who may be able to help, whether teachers, year advisor, counsellor or any other person.

Our Athletics Carnival went very well this year, with an increase in participants. While we were unfortunately affected by a sudden storm on

Monday, we were able to finish all events on Wednesday afternoon. I greatly appreciate the support and effort of all staff involved.

Year 7 Report

This term is definitely flying by... 9 weeks into the beginning of high school and so many great things have happened.

Year 7 recently participated in a Welfare day. The focus of the day was to make sure students are aware of what bullying is, who to see if indeed they are being bullied and what the result of this behaviour can do to students. We were also very fortunate to have the Nation's Number 1 Anti-bullying Campaigner 'Brett Murray' speak to our Year 7 and Year 8 cohort. It was an engaging presentation which educated, inspired and empowered our students.

Elevate was also invited to our school to conduct seminars for the Year 7 group regarding 'Study Skills Kick Start'. Elevate is Australia's largest provider of study skills programs to Australian secondary schools. Elevate seminars are presented by young students who have recently 'faced and aced' the final years of high school themselves.

Year 7 are currently preparing for NAPLAN (National Assessment Program Literacy and Numeracy) which will be held in May. They are practicing past papers which cover numeracy, reading, writing, spelling, punctuation and grammar.

Our swimming carnival and athletics carnival was a great success. It was great to see the students cheering their peers on and earning points for their house group. Keep up the effort, well done!

Over 70 students and 5 teachers attended camp at Mangrove Mountains Outdoor Education Experience. This was a great opportunity for students to mix with other students outside of their classes. Students found an enormous amount of personal satisfaction in overcoming their fears in the many activities they participated in such as abseiling, rock climbing, high ropes and giant swing. Trust, teamwork and problem solving skills were a major component in completing and attempting these activities. It was great fun.

Step Up Mentoring program has started this term. Thank you to all the teachers who have volunteered their time for this successful program where teachers will mentor Year 12 students on study skills, time management, exam questions and other school issues. Please make the most of the valuable time your teachers are offering if you are part of this program. All students should be meeting with their Mentors at least once a fortnight.

Year 12 should be attending all set classes that are on their timetables. If Year 12 has any free periods, they should be in the library completing homework, assessment tasks or exam study. The library is a valuable resource for learning **not** socialising with your friends. Time management is very important in the HSC year!

On the 3rd April all Year 12 will be participating in an information session presented by Ian West from the Board of Studies and HSC coaching sessions. This will give all Year 12 students valuable insight into the HSC.

Just a reminder that all Year 12 students are not permitted to leave school grounds during breaks or free periods unless you have an appointment or TAFE. Appointment notes need to be taken to the office before school for an early leavers pass. During your free periods you are encouraged to use the library resources to research and complete tasks or make study notes for your exams.

Thank you to the students who have joined our Year 12 Formal Committee. We will be meeting in Week 10 to discuss your ideas!

Attendance at school is to be above 85% in all classes. All days absent must be explained with a note from your parent/carer. If a Year 12

student's attendance falls below 85%, a letter will be sent home and students take the risk of failing subjects. Please see me if you are having problems with attending classes or school before it is too late.

We have had a few students leave school in the last couple of weeks due to satisfactorily obtaining fulltime work, Apprenticeships and Traineeships. I am very proud of you all and wish you all the very best in your future employment.

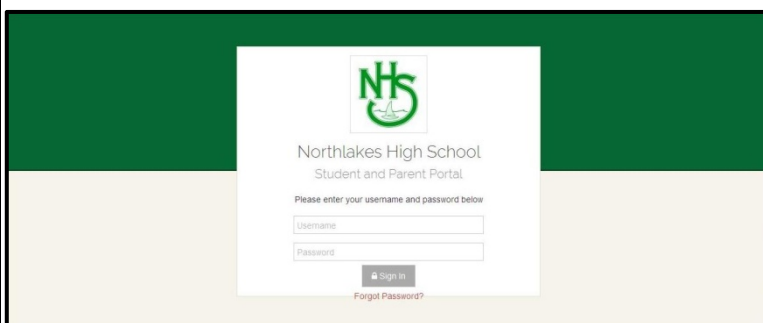
ITPs for students in Years 8 and 9 will be held either later in the term or early next term when classroom teachers are available to set up meeting times with parents.

We are very excited to announce our new Northlakes High School Parent Portal.

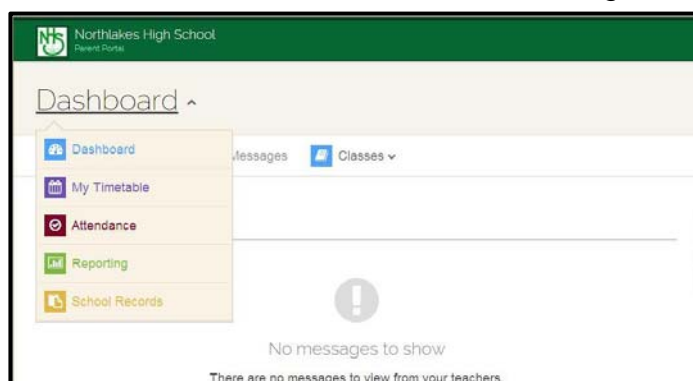


This is a website set up specifically for our Parents and Carers where they can:

Mathematics Report

It has been a busy start to the year in Mathematics, with classes starting the year well and settling in nicely. All Year 7 to 10 classes have reached the end of their first topics and will have either completed their first assessment tasks, or will complete one in the next few weeks.

This provides a good opportunity to remind students of the importance of bringing all their equipment to each lesson and for their topic tests. Each student should have an exercise book, their own set of pens and pencils for diagrams as well as their own calculator. New HSC approved calculators can be purchased from the canteen.

Students in Year 7 and 9 completed a practice Naplan task, which has been marked and will be handed back to the students. The test papers have been annotated with the specific strand of each question. We will be looking at weaknesses in particular strands and hoping to provide further revision and practise to help raise students' results.

We are continuing to extend our QuickSmart and Extension Programs, as they are valuable in moving our students through the Numeracy Continuum, as well as further extending our gifted and talented students.

The school has also resubscribed to Maths Online. The user name and passwords are the same as last year, with all the previous progress saved. If a student has forgotten their user name or password, just ask their classroom teacher.

I would like to welcome back Mr Martin to the Mathematics faculty. He has re-joined us after teaching at a primary school last year.

It has been a very busy term, and we look forward to finishing this term off strongly with assessment tasks and parents interviews.

Both shows are the largest of their kind and showcase the emerging Performing Arts talent from NSW Public Schools from right across the State. Once again, the indigenous students are demonstrating their skills, and as a school we are very proud of their achievements. They have also supplied an audition item for Youth in Performing Arts showcase and hopefully this will be successful.

Music students have also been busy auditioning for Youth in Performing Arts, concerts and assemblies. Jacob Thomas from Year 12 has been part of a mentoring program being run at Gina Jeffreys's studio at Erina. He has also been selected as a featured vocalist for Star Struck and as an act for Youth in Performing Arts. Jayden Stewart from Year 12 and Jackson Wood from Year 11 won the "Sing your face off" competition run by Toukley RSL. He currently has applications in with the Talented Youth Program and School Spectacular and we wish him all the best.

Other Music students have been generating their own success with a record number of applications for the Talented Youth Program with the Arts Unit and audition items for Youth in Performing Arts showcase.
