STATEMENT OF INTENT:

RATIONALE:

This Policy is intended to:

- Monitor student behaviour
- Inform parents about student behaviour
- Support positive behaviour
- Explicit teaching of behaviour code for students-https://education.nsw.gov.au/content/dam/main-education/policy-library/public/implementation-documents/pd-2006-0316-01.pdf
- Monitor student attendance
- Support and inform staff with strategies and practices to promote positive student behaviour
- Develop socially responsible young people who are capable of making informed decisions
- Maintain high standards of discipline

PROCEDURES:

- Follow PBL expectations
 - Respectful
 - > Responsible
 - Personal Best
 - Record Student behaviour in Sentral
- If the student displays persistent disobedience the teacher must give:
 - > Use strategies from classroom flow chat (see page xx) including verbal warning
 - > 2nd verbal warning with explanation of school's PBL explanations
 - > 3rd verbal warning with explanation of consequences and contact parents, removal from classroom, referral to Head Teacher, yellow card, detention etc
- Continued Disobedience can result in:
 - Complete monitoring slip (yellow card) with appropriate goals
 - > Removed from classroom
 - > Record of student behaviour and notify Head Teacher on Sentral
 - ➤ If necessary refer to Head Teacher with monitoring slip accompanied with another student
- Follow Student Behaviour Monitoring Yellow Card, Orange Card, Red Card (see attached)

Yellow Card

 Student Placed on Yellow card by Classroom Teacher after completing steps within the classroom behaviour flowchart (CBF)

 Student is placed on a Yellow Card Sentral Referral •Reflection Time with classroom teacher •Student-Teacher Conference (recorded on back of Yellow Card) •Phone call to Parents and email through Sentral home - record details on 1st Incident Sentral •Incident recorded on Yellow Card and Sentral •Reflection & Conference with classroom teacher 2nd Incident •Incident recorded on Yellow Card and Sentral Referral to HEAD TEACHER for persistent disobedience •Reflection with Classroom Teacher & Goal Setting •CRT to call Parents - record details on Sentral 3rd Incident Incident recorded on Yellow Card and Sentral •Referred to HEAD TEACHER

Student remains on yellow card until:

4th Incident

• Student has achieved 3 consecutive satisfactory lessons.

Student placed on ORANGE CARD

•Reflection time with HT (First one on Orange Card)

• Student moves to an Orange Card

Yellow Card

- Students are placed on a yellow card for behaving in a manner that is not acceptable at Northlakes High School.
 Student behaviour will be monitored by CRT each lesson and recorded.
 Reflection time is to be issued for each 'unsatisfactory' lesson achieved by the student.
 Students remain on this card until they demonstrate appropriate behaviour for 3 consecutive lessons, or, in the event of continued poor behaviour, are placed on a Orange Card Monitoring via HT referral.

Some questions to ask the student during conferences...

What happened to cause you to be placed on a Yellow Card?	What did you think when you realised what had happened?
What were you thinking at the time?	What impact has this incident had on you?
What could you have done differently to behave more appropriately?	What impact do you think this incident has had on others in the class?
Who has been affected by what you have done? In what way?	What has been the most difficult thing for you?
What do you need to do to make things right?	Are you clear about what is expected from you in the classroom? Explain?

- Student HT Conference recorded in Sentral

1st Unsatisfactory

- Sentral Referral by Classroom Teacher
- Reflection with HT following Lesson
- Phone call to Parents by HT to be recorded in Sentral
- Consequence Extra Lesson of monitoring

2nd Unsatisfactory

- Sentral Referral by Classroom Teacher
- Reflection with HT following Lesson
- HT referral to Red Card Teacher

Student completes Orange Card after:

- 5 lessons of 'Satisfactory' recorded with NO 'U's'
- Student moves to Red Card

Orange Card

- Students are placed on an Orange card for behaving in a manner that is not acceptable at Northlakes High School.
 Student behaviour will be monitored by CRT on behalf of the HT each lesson and recorded.
 Reflection time is to be issued for each 'unsatisfactory' lesson achieved by the student.

- Students remain on this card until they demonstrate appropriate behaviour for 3 consecutive lessons, or, in the event of continued poor behaviour, are placed on a Red Monitoring Card.

Some questions to ask the student during the first reflection lesson (write answers on space provided)

What happened to cause you to be placed on a Yellow Card?	
What were you thinking at the time?	
What could you have done differently to behave more appropriately?	
Who has been affected by what you have done? In what way?	
What do you need to do to make things right?	
What did you think when you realised what had happened?	
What impact has your behaviour had on you?	
What impact do you think your behaviour has had on others in the class?	
What has been the most difficult thing for you?	
Are you clear about what is expected from you in the classroom? Explain?	

Red Card

- Student placed on Red Card –Red Card Teacher (RCT) or DP advise parent/carers. All recorded on Sentral
- Reflection Time each day in Labs with RCT

1st Unsatisfactory

- Sentral Referral by Classroom Teacher
- · Lunchtime Reflection in Labs
- Student RCT Teacher conversation.
- · Consequence Extra day given.

2nd Unsatisfactory

- Sentral Referral by Classroom Teacher
- Lunchtime Reflection in Labs
- Phone call to Parents by RCT to be recorded Sentral
- · Consequence Extra day given.

3rd Unsatisfactory

- Sentral Referral by Classroom Teacher
- · Lunchtime Reflection in Labs
- Placed on In-School Withdrawal by Deputy Principal
- Referral to Deputy Principal: Student DP Conference and phone call home
- Student issued with In-school Withdrawal or Formal Caution. Students with previous Formal Caution - DP Confernce

Student completes Red Card after:

- 5 days of 'Satisfactory' lessons recorded with NO 'U's' and/or 'Satisfactory' completion of restorative practice.
- Returning from In-School Withdrawal or issued Formal Caution



Red Card

- You have been placed on a Red Card as a result of your choice to behave in a manner that is not acceptable at NHS.
- Your behaviour will be monitored and recorded **each** lesson, for a minimum of 5 school days.
- For each day that you are on this card you are expected to attend REFLECTION TIME EVERY LUNCH 1 in LABS.
- You are required to <u>arrive promptly at the LABS</u> and complete a workbook <u>in silence</u>. If you do not attend or complete the workbook you will receive an unsatisfactory grading (**U**).
- Getting U's whilst on this monitoring card will extend your time on this card.
- Continued unsatisfactory behaviour whilst on Red card will result in a conference with the Deputy Principal. Deputy Principal strategies may include a 'Formal Caution of Suspension', 'In-class Withdrawal', 'Alternate Educational Settings', 'Part Day Exemption' or 'Suspension from School'.

Hand this card to your classroom teacher at the BEGINNING of EACH lesson!
