Spelling rule:

Eponyms (take their name from a person or brand).

An **eponym** is a person (real or fictitious) from whom something is said to take its name. The word comes from the Greek "eponymos" meaning "giving name". Eponyms can be things that were initially brand names but now are used to reference entire categories of things. Many diseases are named eponymously for the people who discovered them.
